Cooley Proposal Application Rules

Preference is given to Environmental Studies Majors

It is recommended that applicants submit a draft proposal to a faculty member for review and feedback prior to applying.

Your application packet should contain 1 hard copy of the following

- 1) This completed application form.
- 2) A project statement (maximum 1,000 words) that includes:
 - a. Title, purpose of project and any relevant history behind the project.
 - b. Demonstrated initiative (how you got involved, what you've already done, etc.)
 - c. Plan for implementation: hypothesis (if appropriate), methodology, tangible outcomes and how they will be used and by whom.
 - d. Timeline: schedule and a date of submission of the final report or project.
 - e. Include your name, date, and title of award on the personal statement
- 3) Proposal budget: List items for which support is requested, their cost, and the total amount requested.
 - Funding cannot be used for: travel to scholarly meetings; preparation of thesis copies; salaries and stipends; purchase of classroom books; or purchase of computers and/or printers.
 - List all sources of funding for this project including grants pending or awarded to you or your supervising faculty member.
- 4) A printout of your class list with grades from your student portal (<https://students.ucsc.edu>). After you log-in, click the "evals" link and print the page.
- 5) All upper-division narrative evaluations and prerequisite evaluations and, if you are a transfer student, your advanced standing credit evaluation (available from your college office).
- 6) Items 2 and 3 (your project statement and budget) must be emailed to envs1@ucsc.edu as an attached Word document. Please send a separate email for each award to which you are applying with the name of the award in the subject line.

Incomplete or late applications will not be considered, in fairness to all applicants.
